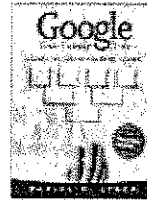

WHY IS "ASK GRANNY" Important?

- How many of you have ever heard someone say Why didn't we ask Granny about that while she still could tell us?
- How many irreplaceable memories are lost each day, each year?
- How can we capture those memories before they are lost?



HOW "ASK GRANNY" WORKS

The program is unique: the specifically designed set of materials is taken to the students, rather than asking them to come to an outside meeting place. Everything is given FREE to the students and no information is never retained by the teachers.

1. Always PRINT
2. Women always go by FULL MAIDEN NAME
3. Dates are written this way: complete day, complete month, complete year: (08 September 1910)
4. Locations are written this way: City, County, State. (Athens, Clarke, Georgia)
